He contributes commentary on Japan to CNN, the BBC, NPR and Japan's NHK, and gives talks at venues worldwide, including The World Economic Forum, TED Talks, Harvard University, the University of California, Berkeley, the University of Tokyo, the Singapore Writers Festival and several anime conventions in the United States.

He has interviewed several notable Japanese artists, including Hayao Miyazaki and Haruki Murakami, and is considered an authority on Japanese culture and media. Kelts has won a Jacob K. Javits Fellowship Award in Writing at Columbia University and a Nieman Fellowship in Journalism at Harvard. He is currently a visiting lecturer at Waseda University and is finishing two books, a novel and a new version of JAPANAMERICA.
